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

**Statement of need:** Diabetes is an insidious disease affecting nearly 40 million Americans, with an estimated 30 million Americans yet to be diagnosed. Untreated diabetes can lead to multiple complications affecting most body systems, many of which are treated by wound care specialists. New technologies, treatments, and clinical guidelines are continuously updated or developed to further one's ability to provide optimal care to this population. This requires providers to stay current in their practice to provide the most optimal care, resulting in the best possible outcomes for the patient. Wound care is multidisciplinary, thus requiring an all-encompassing educational symposium capable of disseminating current information to all.
